This is an excellent venue to view the creative talents of all the participating artists.

READERS THEATER

Readers Theater began in the Spring of 1997 as a way to bring live theater to Easton, evolving over the years with a reputation for presenting humorous, thought-provoking, offbeat material. There is no set format for the annual productions. Sometimes, the program will be a themed collection of one-act plays often including poetry, music, and dance.

Many full-length plays have also been presented. Co-Founders Kit Briner and Geri Gould have pointed out that Readers Theater is an *amateur* project in the truest sense of the word, which means that we do it for the love of it! All participants volunteer their talents to make great theater with every intention of keeping audiences coming back for more.
