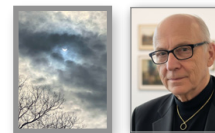


TASTE OF OPERA

The flamboyant *Hot to Trot Trio*, Olga Kalinina, Tom Zimmerman and Joanne Kant, is well known for its "meet and greet" cabaret style. They annually set Easton ablaze with their flashy, funny repartee, and *smoking smorgasbord* of great American Songbook solos, duets, and rhapsodic piano repertoire ranging from Broadway to Opera.

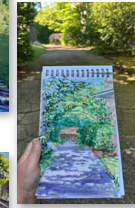
MEMBERS IN THE NEWS...

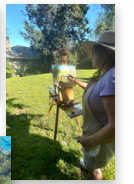

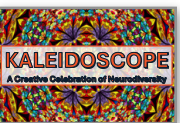
2025 SOLO EXHIBITS

Curator Dolly Curtis and Sheila Weaver produce ten exciting solo exhibits annually, showcasing area artists in the Easton Library Small Gallery and library exhibit cases. Sheila also curates four solo exhibits in the Community Room Gallery, which in 2025 included:
